- Convincing people that websites **are** records and deserve to be archived
- Focus on short-term
- New skills and knowledge needed
- Lack of electronic records management

Problems with them

- Machine dependent
- Variety of file formats used
- “Dynamic” sites
- The sheer size of it all
- How do we ensure accountability?
