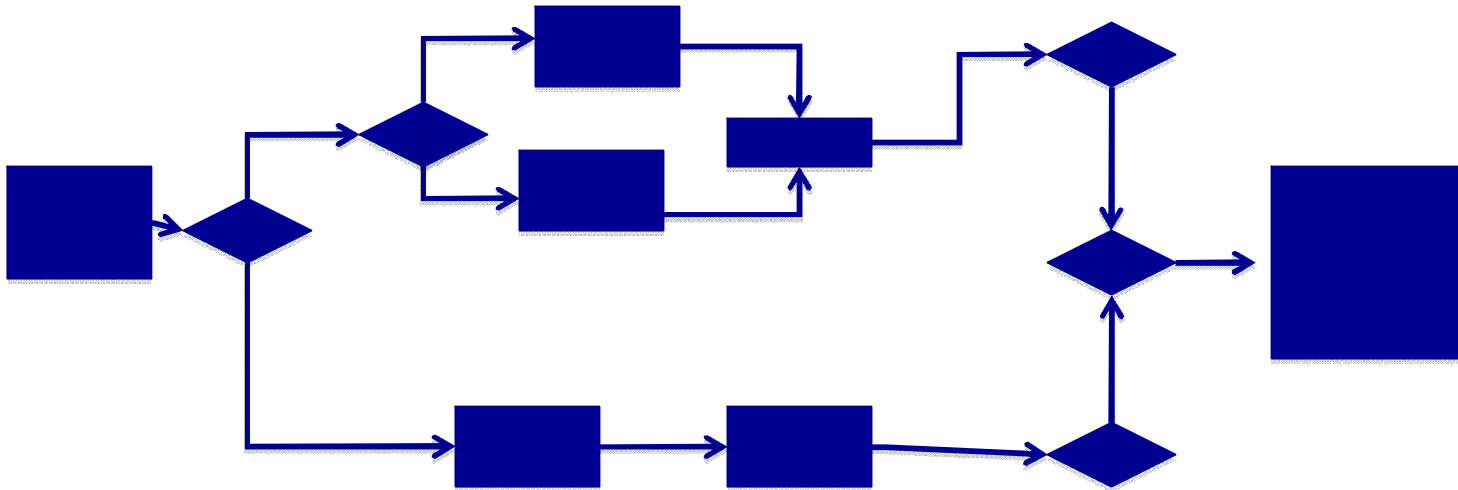

Digital Preservation: a definition

The set of actions required to maintain digital information
in an accessible and authentic form, for as long as
required for business purposes and across changing
technical environments





Digital Preservation: why is it so important?

- *To ensure the right information is captured for the long-term*
- *To ensure digital information held by local archives is secure*
- *To ensure plans and policies are being developed*
- *To facilitate in the management of information for the future including re-use*



21st Century Archives Policy

Key recommendations:

- “fewer, bigger, better” - increased sustainability within the sector
- strengthened leadership and a responsive, skilled workforce
- co-ordinated response to the growing challenge of managing digital information
- comprehensive online access for archive discovery
- active participation in cultural and learning partnerships

Under 'Knowing what you've got', preservation tools provided by The National Archives, such as:

- ✓ **DROID** - a file format identification
- ✓ **PRONOM** is a registry of file format information to assist preservation planning
- ✓ Other types of tools, guidance from us, DPC, SoA and others.....
