IRELAND became a full member of the European Economic Community at midnight last night. The ceremony was marked by simple tree-planting ceremonies in Dublin and other parts of the country. At Charlemagne Buildings in Brussels this morning, the Irish Ambassador to the EEC, Mr. Sean Kerney, who today becomes our Permanent Representative, will hand in documents showing the Irish Government's agreement to a number of EEC arrangements. 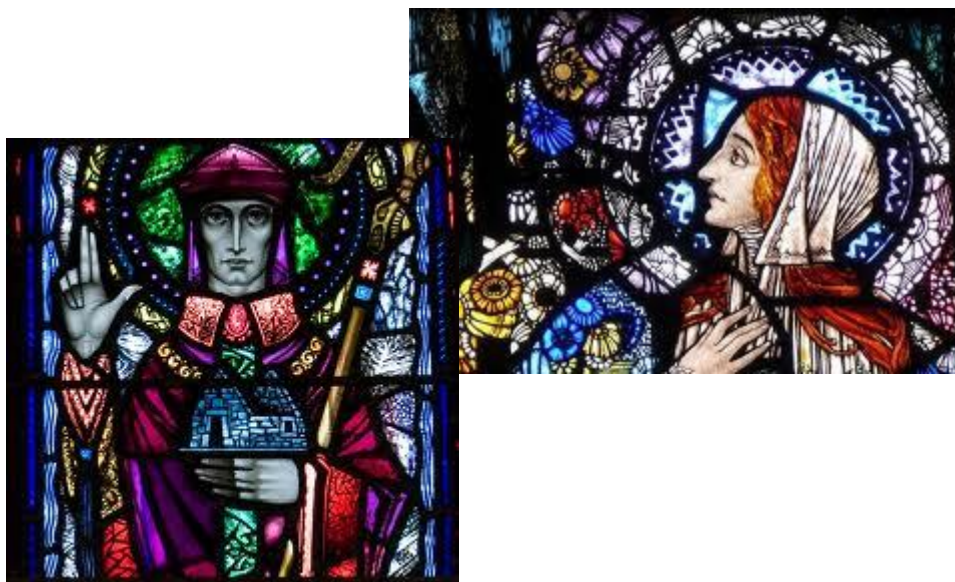
Changing life patterns in Ireland, 1900s to present

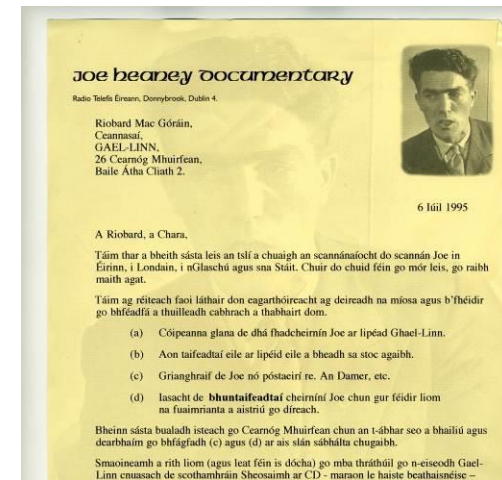

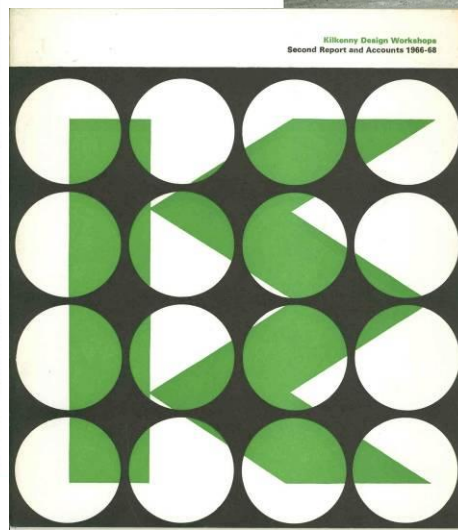
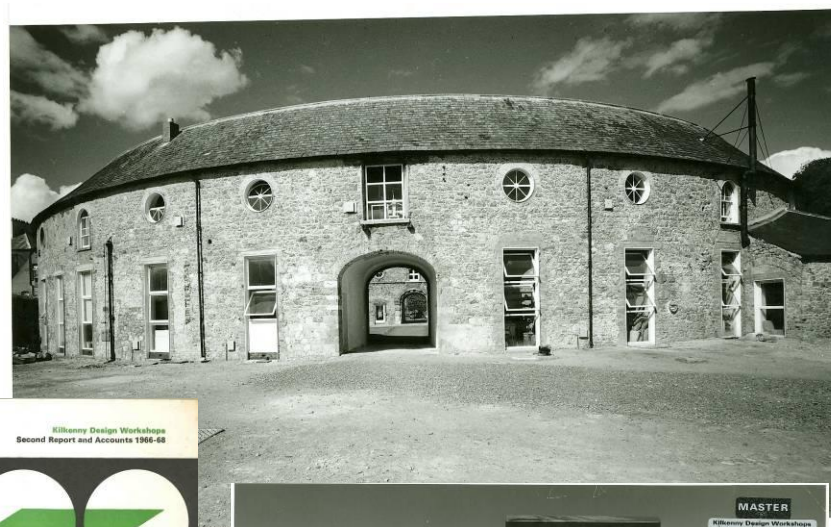
