ULCC has added new repository customers with repositories for three of the previous SHERPA-LEAP partners and a significantly enhanced eprints installation being developed for London's School of Oriental and African Studies.

A renewed partnership with the DPC has helped our digital preservation training programme DPTP ([www.dptp.org](http://www.dptp.org)) to further success and we are looking forward to continued collaboration in the coming year.

We have also built up strong links with the DCC and their DC 101 training course and expect to see closer integration in the coming year.

A number of research and development projects have started or finished in the past year, and we have seen wider uptake of SNEEP ([sneep.ulcc.ac.uk](http://sneep.ulcc.ac.uk)) CLASM has brought together expertise in e-learning systems and repositories and AIDA – a self-assessment tool for DP readiness – has provoked great interest and will be developed further in late 2009.
