
It's important to do what we can now. Don't wait until something is perfect. Have a go, see what happens, share what you learn and ask questions.


Every decision that you take about digital preservation is based on a combination of -

- The skills, resources and budget you have available
- Your collection(s)
- Your organisation
- Your depositors and what they can provide
- Your users, and what they need

There is no single blueprint to follow.

You can learn lessons from other people and organisations, but you have to weigh everything up and decide what is actually useful for you and your organisation.

Pick and choose from others, try something new – but think critically about everything, all the time.



Most people outside of the digital preservation community sadly still believe that backing up equals digital preservation. We know it doesn't, but we will need to keep on explaining this into the foreseeable future.

Consider having different ways of explaining quickly and with conviction why digital preservation is NOT backing up, for archivists, for technical people, for senior managers, even for your friends and family when they ask about your work!!
