### **Requirements for Trust in Preservation**



- » Clear preservation definition and mission
- » Transparency regarding preservation processes and the status of content
- » Reliable delivery of service over time and effective response to events requiring preservation solution
- Willingness to be audited by a trusted third party who will report results to the community
- » Willingness to collaborate with others in the preservation space to find common solutions
- » Research into future preservation needs of the community

## **British Library Partnership**



Portico is delivering content on a daily basis to the British Library to assist with their legal deposit requirements.

Since April 2013, Portico has delivered 72,278 articles, and we are now working with the BL to select publishers for 2014.

Can we leverage this work to assist other national libraries with their legal deposit requirements?



# **Collaboration and Engagement with the Community**



Portico and the KB hosted a Preservation at Scale workshop iPres2013 that drew 30 participants from 17 countries. We are disseminating the workshop presentations and report to the broader community

Portico and CLOCKSS are planning a joint presentation at the annual CrossRef members' meeting to encourage publisher participation in preservation services
