Jargon: What is a KPI?



- Method of measuring performance
- Should be based on what's important to the organisation
- Most KPIs focus upon measures such as:
 - improving revenue
 - reducing costs
 - increasing efficiency
 - improving customer satisfaction

KPI 11	Environmental sustainability	Become one of the most sustainable research intensive universities in the UK with substantial reductions in our carbon emissions	Reduce carbon emissions: scope 1 and 2 by 60%, scope 3 by 30%.

Jargon: Quantitative vs. Qualitative

Quantitative

Quantitative KPIs measure data in numerical terms, such as sales figures or website traffic.

Qualitative

Qualitative KPIs measure non-numerical data and are described as "descriptive" characteristics or subjective interpretations of a person's opinions.

quality over quantity?**

the cultural impact?**
