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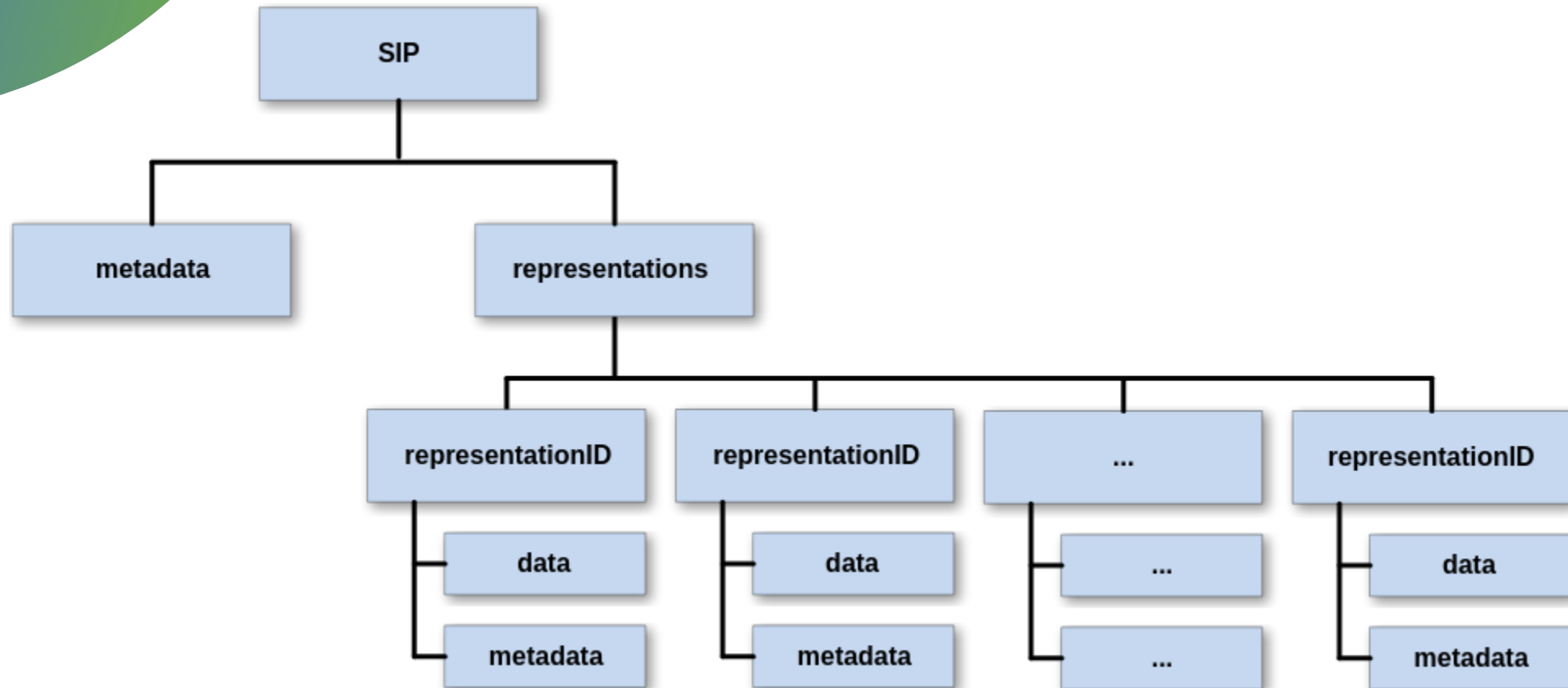

# Our challenges

- We preserve many different types of material, such as books, newspapers, music, radio, television, photos, moving images, webarchives etc.
- We have been digitizing for 20+ years, and have 14 PB of data (x3)
- Changing our bit-repository from Oracle HSM to High Performance Storage System (IBM), and would like to restructure our material at the same time
- We have structured our data in various ways over the years, trying to standardize this now
- We are looking at whether it is possible to structure all material types in the same way

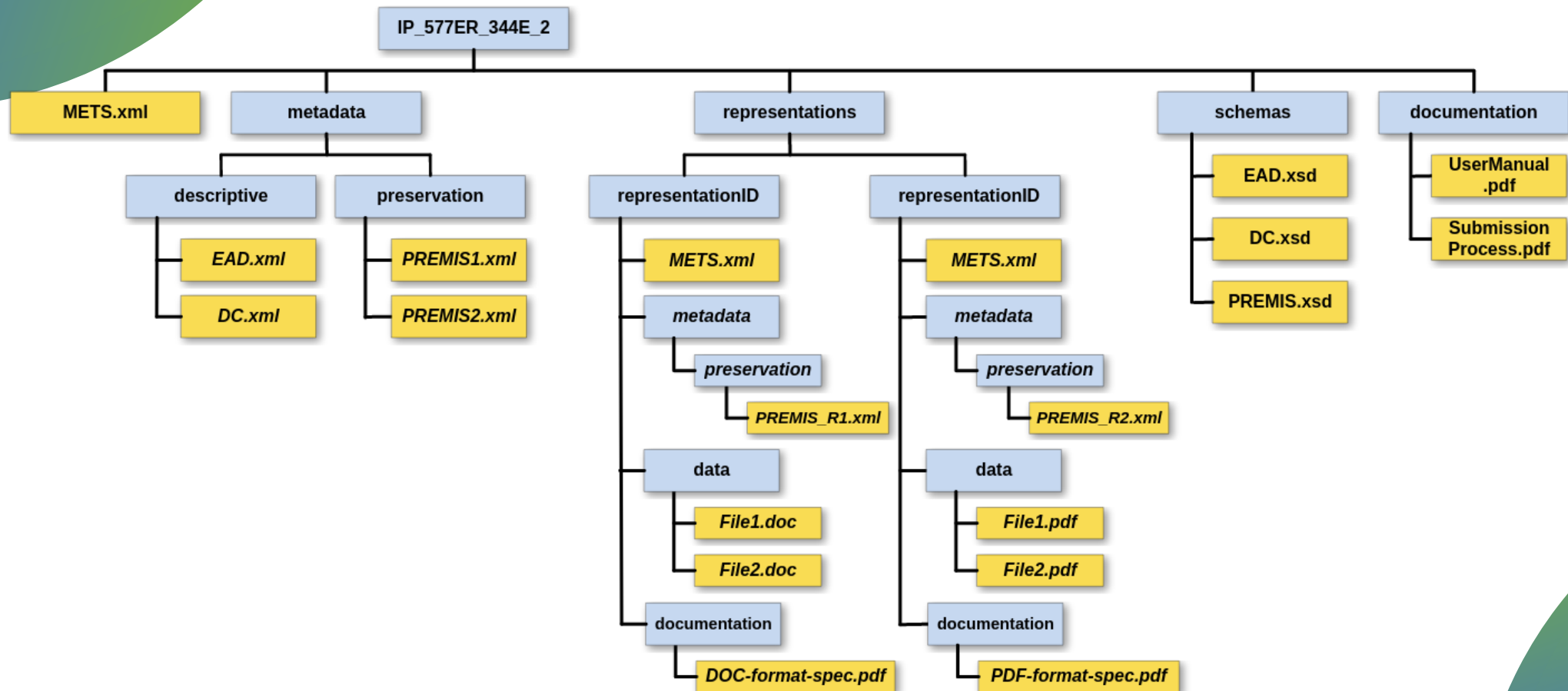
Simplified view of a package structure
