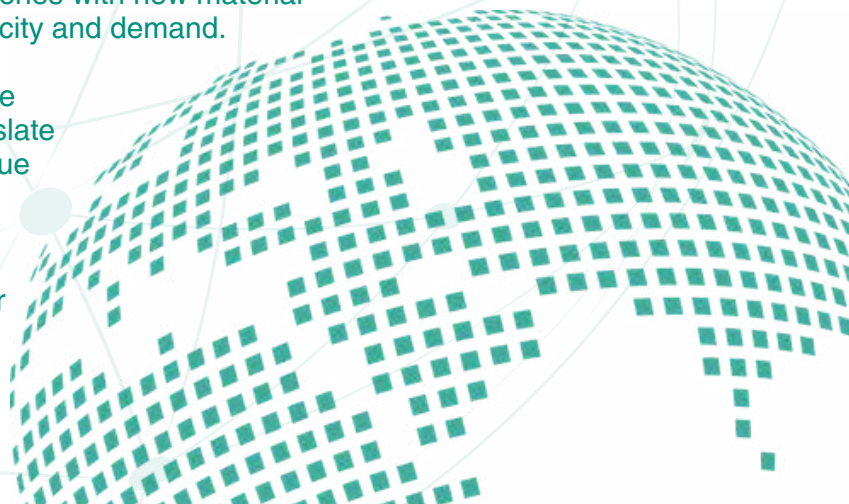
What does the DPC do?

We deliver a set of practical events, activities and publications around digital preservation each year. These are commissioned and overseen by DPC members. The program is the result of continuous consultation with members around the world, about their needs and their successes, and the emerging requirements of the community globally.

Our activities and our community span multiple time zones, so we aim to ensure this program is accessible and useful to all. Most of our events take place online and, as appropriate, these are recorded and made available to all DPC Members so they can be accessed when most convenient. In alignment with our charitable mission, select recordings of events are also made available to the general public. Where possible, we coordinate events across multiple time zones with new material added each time, subject to suitability, capacity and demand.

Key resources, including this prospectus, are available in multiple languages and we translate materials whenever possible. We will continue to expand the availability of our online materials through translation.

We consult partners, communities and other networks around the world to understand their needs, amplify their successes and support their efforts.

STARTING NOVEMBER 2026

New this year and open to all, each themed event will run over three days, with live regional sessions connected through structured conversation and handover from one region to the next. This will create a continuous global dialogue and improve accessibility for the digital preservation community worldwide.

World Digital Preservation Day

World Digital Preservation Day 2026 brings together individuals and institutions from across the world through events and activities that celebrate and highlight digital preservation practice. This year's theme: *'Save our Stories (SOS): Our digital heritage in danger,'* calls on the global community to demonstrate the value of digital heritage, from records and research to cultural memory. Community members and the wider public will be encouraged to take action before our stories are lost through neglect or deliberate destruction in times of conflict and crisis.

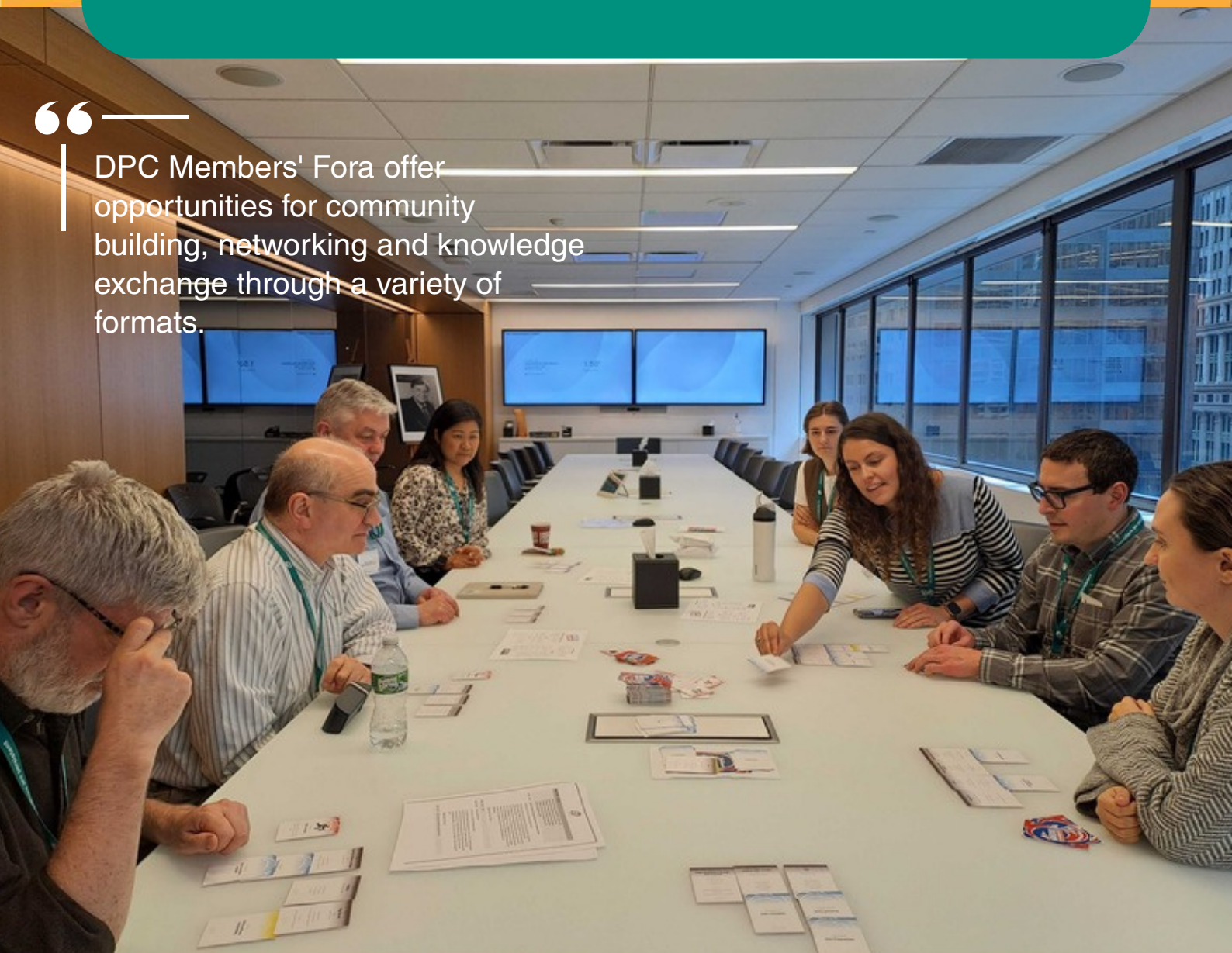
DPC Annual Members Fora and Networking Events

Carbon Calculation Support Group This group was set up for a six-month period from April 2026 to provide a forum to collaboratively test the Carbon Calculation Toolkit, share experiences and develop case studies. Following the Toolkit's launch, the group will continue to support its adoption and share implementation experiences.	Concluding September 2026
<u>Audio Visual Special Interest Group</u> This group brings together DPC Members to discuss issues and challenges relating to the preservation of born digital and digitized audio-visual materials. It provides an opportunity to share experiences, discuss good practice, as well as identify and address common problems.	Ongoing
Digital Forensics Special Interest Group This group meets monthly to discuss the use of digital forensics techniques in digital preservation. Group members set their own agenda and can use these meetings to ask questions, share experiences and discuss challenges around digital forensics tools and workflows.	Ongoing
Managing Indigenous Cultural Material Task Force The Task Force brings together DPC Members to discuss and support the appropriate management of digital Indigenous Cultural Material in Australasia and Asia-Pacific. The group works in conjunction with traditional owners/custodians and communities in alignment with agreed protocols.	Ongoing
Museums and Galleries Special Interest Group This Special Interest Group is open to members who are involved in digital preservation activities in a museum or gallery setting. The group meets every 2 months to share experiences and address topics of particular interest to this sector.	Ongoing
National Libraries and Archives Special Interest Group This group meets every 2 months to provide a forum for those working in national libraries or archives to discuss issues relating to their digital preservation activities as well as share questions and experiences.	Ongoing
<u>Preservation Registries Special Interest Group</u> This group is a place to explore the information sources that digital preservation depends on, and to build connections between collections. The digital preservation community needs reliable information on formats, tools, workflows, software, policies and practices, and this group meets every month to find, interlink and maintain these crucial resources. <u>Web Archiving and Preservation Special Interest Group</u> This group has recently been re-established and will provide a forum for the community to share their experiences and enhance their knowledge of web archiving practice.	Ongoing

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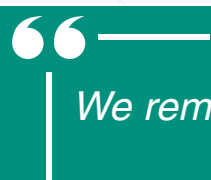
Accountable, Sustainable & Dynamic Governance

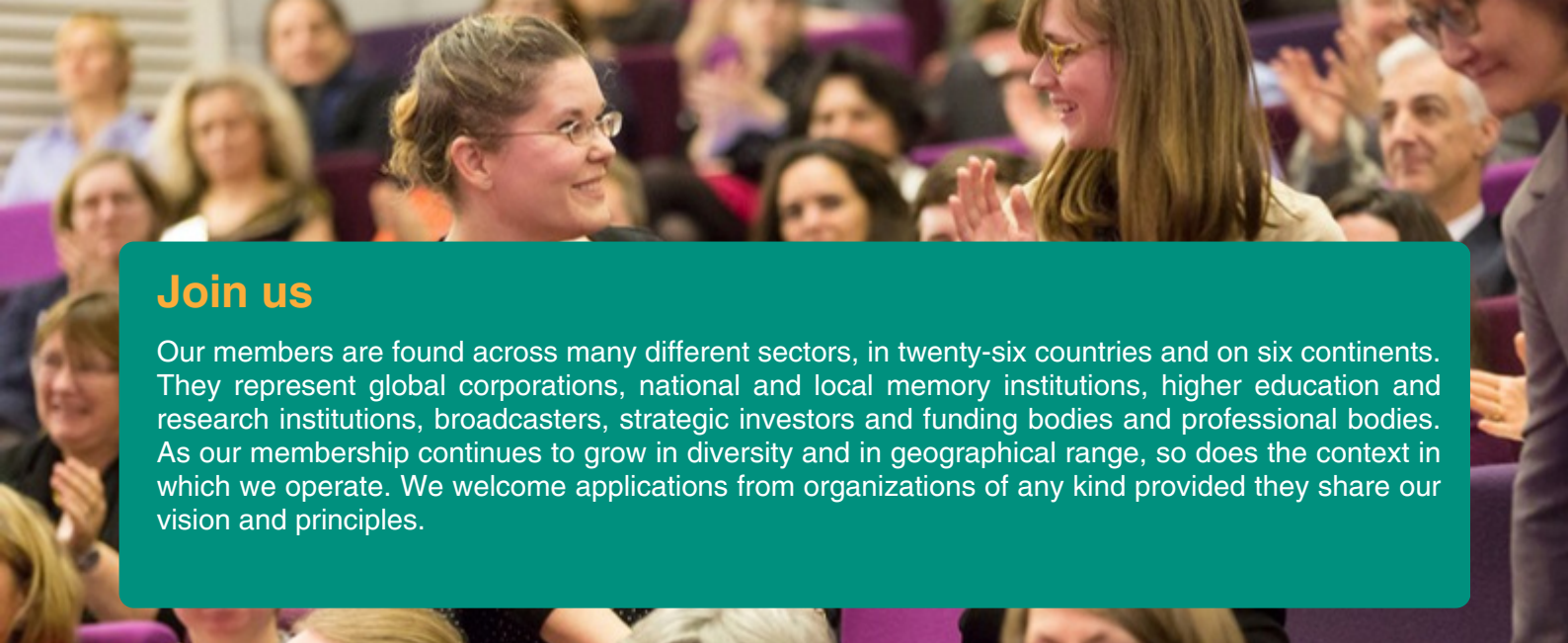
