








Our users – monitoring our performance

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Perspectives from The National Archives – some challenges

- Scale is a challenge (>5 billion resources), in terms of capture, quality assurance, and management
- Despite extensive quality assurance, web archiving is a "lossy" business (especially with website functionality) – how can minimise these problems so we do not "put users off" using and trusting the service?
- Conveying appropriate (contextual) information to users
- *Enabling* large-scale research within limited budgets
- Case studies for use are required, ongoing investment of time and money is required
- Domain knowledge is often difficult to convey

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
